

Quick Start Guide to: Using Turnitin Plagiarism detection

Step 1: Enable OriginalityCheck for each Assignment folder that you would like to have checked for plagiarism through Turnitin.com before students begin submitting their files to the Assignment folder. Step 2: If you would like to allow your students to see their plagiarism score and/or Grademark feedback/score configure the OriginalityCheck options as outlined on this help page: <http://help.d2l.arizona.edu/DBXTii>

Step 3: When you are ready to evaluate student submissions, the first step is to view originality report scores to identify any potential plagiarism issue. To do this, follow the steps found on our help pages at: <http://help.d2l.arizona.edu/DBXViewTiiScore>

Step 4: When you have finished reviewing the originality reports, the next step is to determine how you want to mark up and grade each submission:
